- The Training Council has been assisting the Civil Contractors Federation Training Committee in preparing an Establishment and Variation of Apprenticeships (EVAC) for the State Training Board requesting the conversion of the Certificate III in Civil Construction qualifications from traineeships to A class apprentice qualifications.
- The Training Council has provided industry intelligence to assist the State Training Board in its preparation of the State Priority Occupation List (SPOL) for 2020.

Apprentice Commencements and Training

Apprentice Commencements¹

(as at end December 2019)



This chart illustrates that electrical apprentice commencement numbers continue to grow. There was a 9.9% increase in electrical commencements when comparing Q4 2018 to Q4 2019, whereas construction apprentice commencements decreased by 1.7% when comparing Q4 2018 to Q4 2019.
